

Schedule Part 11 - Order XX Judgment Timeline - One-page Cheat Sheet

Filing gate: classify commercial dispute, specified value, current notified forum and section 12A PIMS/urgent-relief status before institution.

Chapter in 2 Minutes

- Judgment should be pronounced within ninety days after conclusion of arguments and issued electronically or otherwise.
- The commercial CPC amendment is binding process, not a best-practice suggestion.
- Preserve dates, authority, disclosure and court orders because procedural defaults can be irreversible.
- Verify High Court practice directions and e-filing requirements without displacing the statutory Schedule.

Gate	Status	Meaning	Action
Statutory change	Operative with section 16	Judgment should be pronounced within ninety days after conclusion of arguments and issued electronically or otherwise.	Convert the exact Rule into a pleading, evidence and docket checklist.
Deadline/control	Matter-specific	Judgment should be pronounced within ninety days after conclusion of arguments and issued electronically or otherwise.	Assign owner and system reminders; document any extension power and outer limit.
Consequence	Court-controlled	Non-compliance may remove a procedural right or materially change merits.	Reasoned application, response and order.
Local overlay	Verify conflict and supplement	Section 16(3) gives the statutory commercial CPC priority over conflicting local amendments.	Current High Court source and conflict memo.
