

Sixth Schedule - Arbitration and Conciliation Act amendment - One-page Cheat Sheet

Commencement gate: do not use any statutory consequence without checking S.O. 4384(E) and later Gazette notifications.

Chapter in 2 Minutes

- Reworks the Part III conciliation interface and removes overlapping conciliation functions from the arbitration institutional framework.
- Section 61 is not commenced under the reviewed commencement notification.
- Use the India Code Act and the Department of Legal Affairs Gazette files as controlling sources.
- Separate the Mediation Act from existing Commercial Courts, consumer, company, court-annexed and special-statute mediation rules.

Schedule status	Section 61 is not commenced under the reviewed commencement notification.	Reworks the Part III conciliation interface and removes overlapping conciliation functions from the arbitration institutional framework.	Reconcile exact Schedule text, target Act and commencement before use.
Transaction control	Do not assume effective	Reworks the Part III conciliation interface and removes overlapping conciliation functions from the arbitration institutional framework.	Update contracts/forms only after legal effective-date memo.
Litigation control	Event-date law applies	Pending and transitional matters require separate analysis.	Case chronology, pleadings and applicable law snapshot.
